	4) To consider cross-cutting actions and investment required to facilitate data and sample sharing for both the current COVID- 19 response and for future research

	6) To explore and provide advice on collaborative opportunities to advance COVID-19 research, including opportunities at North- South, European and International levels.	
4	Prioritisation and workstreams	
	There was a discussion on the focus and status of the pending <b>research calls</b> by SFI and HRB (and partners).  There was agreement that it is important for these rapid response calls to be announced as soon as possible - many research proposals seeking to inform the immediate COVID-19 response are time critical, it is important that Ireland does not lag further behind the global R&D effort and indeed, connects with many of the developments in train internationally.	
	Importantly, these calls are designed to be adaptive to emerging priorities internationally and to discussions by the Research	All to discuss best way to interface with

	Subgroup/NPHET or other oversight and coordination mechanisms. Funders are open to further calls being developed and announced as required.  The Subgroup will interface with EAG and NPHET to capture their current and emerging priorities and feed them into this subgroup. 5	TM gave an update on work underway to deliver a dedicated National Research Ethics Committee to provide an expedited review mechanism for all COVID-19-related research.  Importantly, the NREC process involves structured coordination with others involved in health research regulation (HPRA and Health Research Consent Declaration Committee) in order to facilitate a single expedited decision. This is aligned with the recommendation set out in the WHO R&D Roadmap to establish expedited and coordinated mechanisms and aligns with NPHET Ethical Framework for decision making which will be published this week.
