

Oireachtas Update



In Dáil Eireann this week, final stage discussion will take place on on the Valuation (Amendment) (No 2), as well as social welfare and educations bills.

The Second Stage of the Thirty-fifth Amendment of the Constitution (Age of Eligibility for Election to the Office of President) Bill 2015 will commence in Seanad Eireann on Tuesday, and continue on on Wednesday. Issues relating to the Freedom of Information Act 2014 will also be discussed on Tuesday and Thursday.

Committee meetings will commence on Finance, Public Expenditure and Reform, and will resume on the Inquiry into the Banking Crisis. The latter will include discussions regarding the functioning of the property market prior to 2008. They will both be discussed throughout the week.

Support for Fine Gael on the rise, according to latest poll

The latest Irish Times/Ipsos MRBI poll shows a rise in support for the Taoiseach and his party, while support for Fianna Fail had dropped by four points since the last poll.

The figures, excluding undecideds are as follows:

Fine Gael were up five points at 24 per cent; Labour up one point to 7 per cent; and Sinn Fein, up two at 24 per cent; Fianna Fail, down four to 17 per cent; and Independents/Others, down four points 28 per cent.

PPS may be available to Gardaí

A special taskforce is considering the value of making citizen PPS numbers available to the Gardaí. This government taskforce will also consider having a car owner's PPS attached to their car registration. The changes were proposed by the Criminal Justice working group, a group dedicated to helping road traffic crime enforcement.

While the Gardaí currently have access to asylum seeker numbers, they are not one of the agencies that can access Irish citizen's PPS number. The working group has also suggested that PPS exchanges should be mandatory between buyer and sellers, when dealing with the private of a vehicle.

The Data Protection office has said that any such system would be done in compliance with the Data Protection Acts. The working group have not issued a formal decision as of yet, but it is forthcoming.

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BAI issue guidelines for referenda reporting

The Broadcasting Authority of Ireland (BAI) has issued guidelines for the coverage of the forthcoming referenda.

On 22 May, the Irish people will be faced with two separate referenda—the same-sex marriage referendum, and the Age of Presidential Candidates referendum. This week the BAI released an updated version of the 'Guidelines in Respect of Coverage of Referenda'.

Some of the provisions provided for are the ban on political advertising, requirements regarding the transmission of any party political broadcasts, and the duty to transmit announcements communicated through the Referendum Commission. It also addresses issues such as opinion polls, social media contribution use on-air, and a ban on presenters using their position to encourage a vote for any particular outcome from their audience.

The guidelines supplement the BAI Code of Fairness, Objectivity and Impartiality in News and Current Affairs

Compliance with the guidelines came into effect immediately; compliance with a moratorium on Referenda coverage will come into effect from 2pm on the day prior to the opening of polling stations; it will end at the close of polling stations on 22 May.
