# SLÁINTECARE ACTION PLAN REPORT Q1 DELIVERABLES

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#### **Executive Summary**

A detailed Sláintecare Action plan for 2019 was completed and published on March 13<sup>th</sup> 2019. The Action Plan sets out detailed deliverables and timeframes for 239 deliverables that are to be progressed in 2019 as part of the implementation of the Sláintecare vision and firmly establishes a programmatic approach to the delivery of the Sláintecare Strategy. The 28 deliverables for Quarter 1 are on track.

In the first quarter of this year the Sláintecare Programme Implementation Office (SPIO) team has been mobilised to support and drive the implementation of these projects working in partnership with the Department units, the HSE and other partners.

During the first quarter of 2019, the Sláintecare Executive Director and SPIO team have continued to engage with citizens, stakeholders and frontline staff across the health and social care service to ensure that these voices are involved in the design and delivery of the Sláintecare vision. A number of workshops, site visits and engagement events have taken place around the country with frontline clinicians. Two briefing sessions have been held with members of both the Joint Committee on Health and the former Committee on the Future of Healthcare. The Citizen Engagement and Empowerment Programme continues to be rolled out, with two regional events taking place in Quarter 1.

The SPIO team continuously engage with the HSE Leadership Team and Strategic Transformation Office to enable an integrated and cohesive approach to the implementation of the Sláintecare 2019 deliverables aligned with the National Service Plan.

#### SPIO Activity for Q1 2019

- The Action Plan for 2019 was compiled and published on March 13<sup>th</sup> following review by the SIAC.
- All 28 of the Q1 Deliverables are on track.
- The dedicated Sláintecare Programme Implementation Office (SPIO) staff of 15 have been mobilised and are now actively working with stakeholders and colleagues to progress the 2019 deliverables.
- The SPIO has a direct allocated budget of €23.5 million for 2019 of which € 20m is for an
  Integration fund which will focus on supporting the development of existing and new best
  practice projects, focused on integrated community-based care, that are capable of being scaled
  nationally.
  - The Integration Fund was launched on March 22<sup>nd</sup> with a call for projects to be submitted by 18<sup>th</sup> April.
- The second Sláintecare Implementation Advisory Council (SIAC) meeting was held on 27<sup>th</sup> Feb. Dr
   Tom Keane is the Chair of the Advisory Council.
- Four stakeholder workshops were held jointly with the Chief Clinical Officer of the HSE, covering topics on chronic diseases and older persons.


- A Citizen and Staff Engagement and Empowerment Programme has been initiated to ensure the voice of service users is heard in the design of the reform programme.
- Content to support a pro-active communications programme for 2019 is in development.
- The SPIO represented the Department of Health at a European Council Social Protection Committee, where the CSR assessment of progress on healthcare was upgraded.
- First quarter progress report 2019 completed and all 28 (100%) deliverables are on track.

#### Key Sláintecare Advancements since September 2018

- The DOH, the HSE and the Irish Medical Organisation (IMO) reached consensus on a major package of GP contractual reforms which will benefit patients and make general practice a more attractive career option for doctors (April 2019).
- The 2019 Healthy Ireland campaign has been announced (April 2019).
- The Smile agus Sláinte National Oral Health Policy has been launched with a commitment to elements of universal healthcare to be implemented between 2020 to 2026 (April 2019).
- The HSE Board has been appointed (January 2019) on an administrative basis and HSE Director General has been appointed (April 2019).
- A reduction in prescription charges and a decrease in the threshold for the Drugs Payment Scheme was announced (March 2019).
- The Scheduled Care Access Plan 2019 has been published (March 2019).
- The Oversight Group to implement new model of public health medicine has been established (March 2019).
- The Independent review group on the role of voluntary organisations (Catherine Day Report) has been published (February 2019).
- The joint policy statement "Housing Options for our ageing population" has been launched (February 2019).
- The Independent Patient Advocacy Service contract has been awarded (December 2018).
- The Healthy Ireland Outcomes Framework has been launched (December 2018).
- The National Patient Experience Survey 2018 was published. 86% were happy with the service they received (November 2018).

Working in close collaboration with an Irish-based online counselling service (Turn2Me.org) funded by a Service Level Agreement, the HSE is currently undertaking two six-month pilot projects exploring the potential to further develop the delivery of counselling online.  Pilot 1 is focussing upon engaging service users who may potentially benefit from counselling to address mild to moderate mental health difficulties through direct referral to free counselling online from their GP. Pilot 2 is targeting service users in the Galway/Mayo and Cork/Kerry regions (CHO 2 & 4) currently on the waiting list for Counselling in Primary Care (CIPC) services. Both cohorts are being offered the opportunity to avail of free counselling online at a location of their choice via their own personal devices.  The use of telepsychiatry is being explored and several pilots are being developed encompassing conducting remote psychiatric consultations to address service needs in mental health services for those with intellectual disabilities, Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services, and alcohol and substance misuse services.  It is also envisaged that a pilot online Cognitive Behavioural Therapy project will be undertaken in the coming months with a view to evaluating the effectiveness of improving access to structured CBT programmes via the internet.  In addition, a state-of-the-art text-based active listening service is scheduled to be launched in the coming months.

A PAS campaign to identify at least 8 ordinary members of the Board,-including a Deputy Chairperson - was undertaken in November 2018. The Minister announced 8 new appointees to the Board on 22 January 2019. The Health Service Executive (Governance) Bill 2018 has been passed by the Seanad and was passed by the Dáil on 3 April 2019.  The Bill as passed by the Dáil provides for an eleven person Board including at least one person who is practicing or has practiced as a member of a health profession. The Bill will now return to the Seanad for confirmation of Dáil amendments. The Minister has also committed to bringing an amendment in the Seanad to increase the clinical expertise membership requirement for the Board from one to two and to expressly provide for a member with financial expertise.  The prospective members of the Board have met and have begun preparation for the formal establishment of the board but have no decision-making powers.
