If you are new to the world of self-employment or are looking to build your business from scratch, <u>Intreo</u> is a great place to start. <u>Intreo (the Public Employment Services)</u> offers you support and financial advice and will help to point you in the right direction.

# **Getting your business started**

### **Back to Work Enterprise Allowance**

The <u>Back to Work Enterprise Allowance</u> (BTWEA) is available to help you to become selfemployed or start your own new business if you are on certain social welfare payments.

If you are getting the <u>COVID-19 Pandemic Unemployment Payment</u> (PUP) and you want to access the this scheme, you can do this by transferring to <u>Jobseeker's Allowance</u>.

The Back to Work Enterprise Allowance allows you to keep the following portion of your current social welfare payment for 2 years:

- 100% for the first year
- 75% for the second year

### **Short-Term Enterprise Allowance**

The <u>Short-Term Enterprise Allowance</u> (STEA) supports you if you have lost your job and want to start your own business. This support is available to COVID-19 Pandemic Unemployment Payment (PUP) recipients who transfer to a <u>Jobseeker's Benefit</u> payment.

The Short-Term Enterprise Allowance is paid instead of your Jobseeker's Benefit for a maximum of 9 months. It ends when your entitlement to Jobseeker's Benefit ends (that is, at either 6 or 9 months).

## **Enterprise Support Grant**

The <u>Enterprise Support Grant</u> (ESG) provides financial support for people who have set up a new business and are currently receiving income support under <u>Back to Work Enterprise</u> <u>Allowance</u> (BTWEA) or <u>Short-Term Enterprise Allowance</u> (STEA).

The grant helps with the costs incurred when setting up a new business.

### **Local Development Company**

<u>Your Local Development Company (LDC)</u> can also offer support and advice in starting a business, including mentoring.
