- Ventilators:
 - On track to meet targeted stock of ventilators by mid-June
- Syringe drivers:
 - There remains a significant gap as regards the targeted stock to service anticipated surge requirements.
 - o Deliveries are ongoing, with further orders being sought
 - All ICUs remain fully serviced. Additional supplies sought amount to surge contingency, rather than immediate need.
- Infusion pumps: procurement target will be exceeded this week.
- Testing:
 - Stock procurement for required capacity of tests per day achieved.
 - Work is continuing on building resilience in supplies.
 - No move in testing strategy towards antibody testing has been communicated from NPHET.
- PPE:
 - Masks: targeted stock level achieved with HSE looking at supplying broader health services demand.
 - Hand Gel: HSE continue to work on building indigenous production capacity
- Dialysis Bloodlines



- HSE continues to work with suppliers to increase haemodialysis capacity over the coming months.
- In preparation for any potential change made by the European Commission with respect to the Commission Recommendation 2020/403 for non-CE marked devices and PPE in circulation, HSE confirms that all PPE purchased have CE certification.
