

### **Introduction**

The Irish Biogeographical Society was founded in 1975. It encourages the study of Irish biodiversity especially the distribution of the plants and animals. The Society is also interested in the biogeographical implications of colonization and past history. From its inception, the Society published an annual *Bulletin*. In 2004, the twenty-eighth issue was produced. The series now contains an impressive database including information on biota outside Ireland. In 1986, a series of *Occasional Publications* was initiated. The seventh volume appeared in 2004. The *Occasional Publications* provide a useful means of publishing the proceedings of conferences or large articles on particular groups.
