Raidió Teilifís Éireann (RTÉ) have created two new positions on their executive board. The new roles are that of director of audience, channels and marketing, and director of operations and production services. These roles follow the restructuring of RTÉ's management by Dee Forbes, the Director-General.

The role of director of audience, channels and marketing has been given to RTÉ One Channel Controller, Adrian Lynch. Mr Lynch has been with RTÉ One as Channel Controller of since 2014, and recently also took over as Controller of RTÉ2. Previously, he worked at Amino Television as Managing Director and Founder.

Frances Abeton has been selected to take up the role of director of operations and production services. Ms Abeton was previously vice-president of Firecrest – a recruitment firm for clinical trials – which is owned by Icon.

NUI Galway have announced the appointment of Professor Ciarán Ó hÓgartaigh to the position of the 13th President of the University. He will succeed the outgoing President Dr Jim Browne, with effect from January 2018.

Professor Ó hÓgartaigh currently holds the position of Principal and Dean of UCD College of Business – and by extension UCD Lochlann Quinn School of Business, UCD Michael Smurfit Graduate Business School and UCD Smurfit Executive Development – since 2011. Prof. Ó hÓgartaigh also held other leadership roles at DCU and Victoria University of Wellington in New Zealand.

He trained as a Chartered Accountant, holds a PhD in Accounting, previously served as the Chair of the Audit Committee at the Department of Marine, Communications and Natural Resources, and is a current member of the Audit Committee at the Department of Finance. He is also a first-class honours, first-in-class graduate of NUI Galway and a former Fullbright scholar at Northeastern University.
