Note: This report will not include data on enhanced surveillance information such as most likely source of transmission and travel. These will now be reported on a weekly basis.

\* The number of cases hospitalised and admitted to ICU described in the above table relate only to COVID-19 cases who were notified during this reporting period, and where the outcome is known at the time of reporting. It does not reflect all hospitalisations and ICU admissions related to COVID-19 which occurred during the period covered by the report. It also does not reflect the final number of cases hospitalised or admitted to ICU for these cases notified during this period as the outcome may not yet have occurred, or is yet to be notified.

On 14 May 2021 the HSE suffered a major cyber-attack on its IT systems. While HSE-HPSC and CIDR were not directly compromised by the cyber-attack, our surveillance partners (Departments of Public Health, laboratories, and others) were. As an interim measure after the cyber-attack, the reported daily number of COVID-19 cases was based on data uploaded to the HSE-CovidCare Tracker (CCT). The data extracted from CCT did not represent notified cases and had not undergone the extent of data validation which is undertaken by Departments of Public Health and HPSC. For this reason, the number of cases reported from CIDR for period affected by the cyber-attack (14th May-1st September) will differ from that previously reported based on CCT data.

Note: Data were extracted from Computerised Infectious Disease Reporting (CIDR) system at 09:00 on 10/09/2021 and are provisional and subject to ongoing review, validation and update. As a result, figures in this report may differ from previously published figures.




Figure 1a. Daily number and cumulative number of confirmed cases of COVID-19, and 5-day moving average, by notification date (n=20874)




Figure 1b. Daily number of confirmed cases of COVID-19, by epidemiological date\*




Figure 3: Cumulative incidence rates of confirmed COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population by county notified in Ireland between 27/08/2021 up to midnight on 09/09/2021

Please do not directly compare county shades to previous maps. The categories listed will change as the number of cases change, which may result in changes to the map shading.




Figure 4: Percentage of confirmed cases of COVID-19 notified in Ireland from 27/08/2021 up to midnight on 09/09/2021,in each age group, all cases, cases admitted to hospital and cases admitted to ICU\*

#### **Technical Notes**

#### 1. Data Source

Data are based on statutory notifications and were extracted from Computerised Infectious Disease Reporting (CIDR) system. Data are provisional and subject to ongoing review, validation and update. As a result, figures in this report may differ from previously published figures.

#### 2. Population data

Population data were taken from Census 2016. Data were aggregated into the following age groups for the analysis: 0-4 years, 5-12 years, 13-18 years, 19-24 years, 25-34 years, 35-44 years, 45-54 years, 55-64 years, 65-74 years, 75-84 years and ≥ 85 years.

#### 3. Epidemiological date

The epi-date is the epidemiological date for a case. It is based on the earliest of dates available on the case and taken from date of onset of symptoms, date of diagnosis, laboratory specimen collection date, laboratory received date, laboratory reported date or event creation date/notification date on CIDR. By using this date rather than event creation/ notification date, adjusts for any delays in testing/notification.
